


General Information

CONFERENCE VENUE

*Maison MINATEC, 3 parvis Louis Néel, 38054 Grenoble cedex 9, France
Tramway line B (direction “Presqu’île”), stop “Cité Internationale”*

The conference hall is located in “Maison MINATEC” in a scientific area named “Polygone Scientifique” that gathers many research institutes, including CNRS (www.grenoble.cnrs.fr), ESRF (www.esrf.eu), ILL (www.ill.eu) and CEA (www.cea.fr). Maison MINATEC is within a walking distance from major hotels and the airport shuttle-bus terminal, or a few stops by the tramway line B (see the map on page 3).

ORAL AND POSTER SESSIONS

Oral presentations:

Invited talk 30 minutes (including 8 minutes discussion)

Contributed talk 20 minutes (including 5 minutes discussion)

Posters:

All posters will be displayed during the entire conference. Useful dimensions of the poster panels are: width = 0.9 m, height = 2.07 m, they are available for display from Wednesday July 1, 18:00 and posters should be removed by Saturday July 4, 18:00. We recommend standard A0 size (84.1 cm × 118.9 cm) posters in the portrait orientation. VELCRO-Brand Sticky Back Coins will be provided for mounting on the panels.

LUNCH

The conference registration includes lunch (for all participants including accompanying persons). The restaurant is in the building neighbouring the conference hall, see the map on the previous page. Attendees will be given tickets to access the restaurant for the 3 lunches on Thursday July 2nd, Friday 3rd and Saturday 4th. Lunches are scheduled between the end of the morning sessions, 12:30, and the beginning of the afternoon sessions, 14:00.



CONFERENCE BANQUET

The conference banquet will be held on Friday evening, July 3rd, starting from 19:30, at the restaurant “Le téléphérique” (restaurant-teleferique.com). The restaurant is located on “La Bastille”, a small fortified mountain from which one enjoys a magnificent view of the Grenoble valley and the surrounding mountains (www.bastille-grenoble.fr/english/). The restaurant is accessed by the cable car, located on the “quai Stéphane Jay”, on the left bank of the Isère river, right at the north entrance of the “Jardin de Ville” (city park), see the map given below. We will provide you a voucher for the ride to be presented at the cable car gate.

To reach the cable car from the conference site or from your hotel, take the tramway B up to the “Hubert Dubedout - Maison du Tourisme” stop in the city centre. Then walk towards and across the “Jardin de Ville” park. Attendees visiting the LNCMI laboratory may follow the group guides after the visit.
